- i. Duration – These examinations shall be of **2 Hours** duration.
- ii. Question Paper Pattern:-
 - 1) There shall be four questions as mentioned hereinbelow.
 - 2) All questions shall be compulsory with internal choice within the questions.
 - 3) Question may be subdivided into sub-questions a, b, c... and the allocation of marks depends on the weightage of the topic.

5.3.2 Passing Standard (for Undergraduate Law Programmes)

5.3.3 Carry Forward of The Marks in Case if The Learner Gets 'F' Grade in One or More Subjects:

- (1) and (2) **Passing marks obtained** in Part-A or Part-B shall be carried forward.
- 3) **Applied Component** passing must for Even Semester End Examinations
Re-examinations of the Applied Component Courses can be conducted
Carry forward of Applied Component marks/credits
- 4) A learner who is **already admitted** to the 3 years or 5 years programmes shall be evaluated for his higher classes/semester under this evaluation pattern
- 5) A learner who is **already admitted but failed** in any of the subjects/courses shall be evaluated under this evaluation pattern, however
Part-A will be of 40 marks (20-project, 10-presentation and 10-viva).
- 6) **Passes in different attempts:** last marksheet **carrying forward** previous marks.

5.4 ALLOWED TO KEEP TERMS (ATKT)

- a) Odd to Even Semester,
- b) Next Class/Year: 2 KT's,
- c) Final Sem. Result: after passing all courses.

5.5 ADDITIONAL EXAMINATIONS

A) Additional Internal Assessment:

- a) The learner to apply within 8 days of the conduct of the examination along with the necessary documents and testimonials.
- b) Additional Internal Examination allowed if participated in Inter Collegiate events, State or National or International level events, Training camp or coaching camp organized by authorized university or state or national or international bodies. NSS / NCC Events / Camps / cultural activities / sports activities / research festival or any other activities authenticated by the head of the institution. or for any other reason considered valid under the circumstances OR fails in Internal Assessment the head of the Institution shall generally grant permission to the learner to appear for the additional class test or assignment.
- c) The principal, on scrutiny of the documents and testimonials. may grant the permission to the learner to appear for the additional examination.

Class test or assignment for Internal Assessment:

- a) A learner who is absent for the class test and the assignment/s will be declared fail in the Internal Assessment Scheme.
- b) Absent for the class test but Appeared for the assignment/s will be allowed to appear for the additional class test of 10 marks.
- c) Appeared for the class test but remains Absent for the assignment/s will be allowed to appear for one additional assignment/class test for of 30 marks and the internal assessment will be calculated as out of 40 marks.
- d) Absent for the class test or one assignment will be allowed to appear for the additional class test/assignment

The Additional Class Test must be conducted 15 days prior to the commencement of the Semester End Examination.

B) Semester End Examinations

Eligibility to Appear for Additional Semester End Examination:

- a) A learner who does not appear i.e. remains absent in some or all the courses on **medical grounds** or for **representing the college/university** in sports, cultural activities, or in the activities of **NSS, NCC** or **sports training camps** conducted by recognized bodies/competent authorities or **for any other reason which is considered valid under exceptional circumstances** and to the satisfaction of the Principal or the Head of the Institute **OR fails** in some or all the subjects is eligible to appear for the additional examination.
- b) **Absent for both** Part-A and Part-B: not be eligible to additional Sem. End Exam.
- c) The additional Semester End Examination shall be of **two hours duration** and of 60 marks per course.

Learners **punished under O.5050** are not eligible to additional examination.

This examination will be held **20 days after the declaration** of results but **not later than 40 days**
