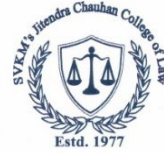

WRITTEN SUBMISSION

Written Submission

1. Students are required to prepare separate written submission for each subject on the topic allotted to them by the faculty in charge of the subject.
2. **The topic allotted to the student shall be final.**

Guidelines for Written Submission

1. The Written Submission must be **handwritten** and written in **English**.

2. The submission shall consist of **maximum 5 pages on A4 Size Sheets (Assignment Paper)**
3. An additional page may be used for citing the references/bibliography.
4. Footnotes must conform to any authoritative standard rules of legal citation.
5. The pages should be numbered appropriately.
6. An additional page must be used as the Cover Page of the submission. It should contain the following details:
 - Title
 - Subject
 - Student name
 - Roll number & Division
 - College Name
 - Name of the faculty in-charge
7. Students are required to submit the written submission to the faculty at the time of ***the Presentation.***

PRESENTATION

1. Each student shall prepare an oral presentation based on the topics allotted to them for all subjects.
2. Every student shall be allotted a total of **three minutes** to speak on their topic.
3. Presentation for each subject shall be held between ***23rd March 2026 & 27th March 2026***, the detailed schedule for the same shall be communicated in due course.
