MAXIMUM MARKS - 20

1. Students are required to prepare separate project for each subject.
2. Students are required prepare project on topic given by their faculty in charge as per their roll nos. Student may refer to books, research articles, case laws, etc., for writing the projects. **The project topic allotted to the student shall be final.** Any change made in the topic without the consent of the concerned faculty won't be accepted.

Guidelines for Project Submission

1. The project must be written in English.
2. The project shall be of a minimum 2000 words and should not be more than 5000 words (excluding footnotes, abstract).
3. Footnotes must conform to any authoritative standard rules of legal citation.
4. **The projects shall undergo a review for plagiarism and any evidence of plagiarism found shall result in reduction of marks.**
5. Font & Spacing Criteria:
 - Font Type (body of the document) - Times New Roman
 - Font size (body of the document) – 12 pt.
 - Line spacing option - 1.5
 - Font Type (Footnote) - Times New Roman
 - Font size (Footnote) – 10 pt.
 - Margin spacing - 1 inch on all sides of each page.
7. The pages should be numbered appropriately.

8. The Projects submitted should compulsorily contain the following contents:

- i. Cover Page
- ii. Acknowledgment
- iii. Table of Contents
- iv. Introduction
- v. Body of your Project
- vi. Bibliography

9. The Cover Page of the project must contain the following details:

- Title
- Subject
- Student name
- Roll number & Division
- College Name
- Name of the faculty to whom the project is being submitted

10. The File Name while submitting your Project must be in the following format only:

11. The file should be sent in PDF format only.
12. The mode of submission of the project shall be communicated in due course.
13. Students are encouraged to be creative with respect to their submissions
