COMPONENT I: CERTIFICATE COURSE

Each student is required to complete the Certificate Course on Alternate Dispute Resolution (ADR) organized by the College. The course comprises nine online lectures and one masterclass, which will be conducted during the months of August and September. A minimum of 75% attendance is mandatory to be eligible for the course completion certificate.

Multiple Choice Question examination, based on the lecture content, shall be held on **17 October 2026**.

COMPONENT II - PRACTICAL EXAM

Client Counselling Simulation

- i. For this component each student shall be required to be present in college on the assigned date. A client interview between an Advocate and a Client shall be virtually displayed. Each student must observe the virtual session and write a report on the best solutions (counselling) that they would have given the client.
- ii. A Mock exam of this component shall be held on **7th October 2026** from **5:00pm to 6:00 pm**.
- iii. The practical exam schedule for 10/10/2026 shall be notified subsequently.

COMPONENT III: JOURNAL SUBMISSION

The Journal shall comprise the following units:

I) Legal Services Authorities Act, 1987 (10 Marks)

Write a brief note on the following:

- Authorities
 - ✓ Constitution, Powers & Functions of National Legal Services Authority,
 - ✓ Constitution, Powers & Functions of District Legal Services Authority
- Persons eligible for getting free legal services
- Lok Adalat
- Permanent Lok Adalat

II) Research for Public Interest Litigation (10 Marks)

Objective: To investigate a local environmental / Social issue through a field survey and evaluate its potential for filing a Public Interest Litigation (PIL).

1. Topic Selection & Legal Framing - Choose a real Social or environmental issue and understand the legal framework.

Example: Improper Garbage collection - Research Relevant Law(s) / Rule(s) (e.g., Municipal Corporation of Greater Mumbai Bye-Laws Framed Under Section 461(ee) Of Mumbai Municipal Corporation Act, 1888 For Regulating all Matters and Things Connected with The Collection, Removal and Disposal of Solid Waste)

2. Determine if the issue potentially violates fundamental rights (e.g., Article 21 – Right to clean environment).

3. Write: A one-page concept notes outlining:

- Chosen issue
- Locality
- Law(s) potentially violated
- Justification for PIL relevance
- Any supporting evidence of the issue (optional) (e.g. images of the garbage dump / improper collection)

III) Case Comment (10 Marks)

Students shall write a Case Comment on **ANY ONE** of the following case of their choice.

- *Supriya Chakraborty v. Union of India, 2023 INSC 920*
- *Sita Soren v. Union of India, (2024) 3 S.C.R. 462*
- *Animal Welfare Board v. Union of India, 2023 INSC 548*
- *Ashwini Kumar Upadhyay v. Union of India & Anr. 2023 INSC 991*

Format - The case comment must comprise of the following particulars:

- Case Details
- Relevant law
- Relevant Background Facts
- The issues in the case
- The ratio / Ruling of the case
- Judgment
- Impact of the judgment.

Note: Students may add arguments of both parties if they consider it relevant.

COMPONENT IV

Drafting a Negotiation Plan

Based on the set of facts given in Annexure 1, You will draft a negotiation plan from the side of the Responding or Requesting party, as specified in the **Fact Sheet**.

The purpose of the Negotiation Plan is to present the objectives and goals of the respective party (Responding / Requesting) to the Negotiation Simulation. A Negotiation Plan contains a brief case analysis evaluating strategic strong points and weak points of each party, an outline of your respective party wants, interests, BATNAs and what is the worst outcome if the negotiation fails.
